Since our chapter house has gone so long without substantial renovation, we were at a huge disadvantage against other fraternities. For these reasons, we have taken immediate actions to renovate the house and develop better recruitment plans. We spend an entire week prior to rush fixing and cleaning the house and plan on doing monthly house projects to help renovate the house. As a former recruitment chairman, I observed the previous recruitment chairs strategy during the summer and recruitment week. I noticed that summer recruitment did not make as much as an impact compared to recruitment week. The new recruitment chairs have now developed a new plan to make our focal point during recruitment week. I believe this will increase our chances of receiving more new members.

Gamma Iota's future is bright, with our members eager to strive for success. Hopes are high looking forward into Fall 2016. We believe that we can bring our chapter back to its rightful place as the best on campus. We dedicate ourselves to the ideal of being Better Men and hope that others will follow. training, collaborative goal setting and alumni/National support, I am confident the chapter will grow in order that we may accomplish our goal of producing better men. I have seen the vision



## A Letter of Appreciation


